ue to COVID-19 pandemic precautions, CKenergy will hold a non-traditional, modified Annual Meeting of Members on Friday, July 31 at the Pioneer Cellular Event Center in Weatherford with registration beginning at 10:00 a.m.

Registration will begin at 10:00 a.m. at the Pioneer Cellular Event Center with a drive-through registration option available. Members will register and receive their \$20 bill credit on their electric account.

A meal will not be served and entertainment will not be provided, but all registered members will receive a \$20 bill credit on their account.

If members want to register inside, you can do so in the lobby of the Pioneer Cellular Event Center or you can utilize the drive-through registration option. Your registration card is located on page 8. Please fill it out and bring it with you.

If a quorum is present, the business meeting will begin promptly at 11:00 a.m. in the Pioneer Cellular Event Center. The business meeting can also be accessed online(via a live stream on our Facebook page).The meeting agenda will address the essential business required by the CKEC bylaws. It will not include the education and social components normally part of our meeting; however, we look forward to celebrating these values with our members again next year.

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Giving Back



here are many benefits to being a member of an electric cooperative, including the significant positive impact it can have on your community.

Electric cooperatives are known for their dedication to the betterment of the communities in which they are located. A couple of ways that we are proud to give back to our communities are through gross receipts tax to local school districts and Operation Round Up.

On a percentage basis, electric cooperatives contribute more tax dollars to local school districts than do other utilities. In Oklahoma, a 2 percent gross receipts tax on revenue is paid by both the wholesale and retail level. Investor-owned utilities pay ad valorem taxes instead of a gross receipts tax. Only a percent of this tax goes to school districts with which they own property. Municipal utilities contribute no tax money to public schools in Oklahoma.

As a member of CKenergy Electric Cooperative, you have the opportunity to participate in the Operation Roundup program. The program works by allowing co-op members to round up their monthly electric bills to the nearest dollar amount. The spare change is transferred to CKenergy's Operation Round Up fund and dispersed to local charitable causes.

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Our foundation approved a total of **\$107,649.63** in grants for 2019.

Those funds were used to improve the lively hood of individuals, fund school programs, help volunteer fire departments purchase new equipment, and so much more!








Interest on Long Term Debt

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Capital Credit Allocation

In June, CKenergy retired or paid by cash or bill credit— **\$2,173,042.30** to **8,856** members across portions of ten counties served by CKEC.

As a member-owner of a not-for-profit electric cooperative, your share of co-op margns is based on the amount of electricity you use during the year.

The decision to refund capital credits rests solely with the CKEC board and is dependent on the finanical condition of the co-op and the provisions of its bylaws.
