

# **GIVING BACK**

here are many benefits to being a member of an electric cooperative, including the significant positive impact it can have on your community.

Electric cooperatives are known for their dedication to the betterment of the communities in which they are located.

A couple of ways that we are proud to give back to our communities are through gross receipts tax to local school districts and Operation Round Up.

On a percentage basis, electric cooperatives contribute more tax dollars to local school districts than do other utilities. In Oklahoma, a 2 percent gross receipts tax on revenue is paid by both the wholesale and retail level.

Investor-owned utilities pay ad valorem taxes instead of a gross receipts tax. Only a percent of this tax goes to school districts with which they own property.

Municipal utilities contribute no tax money to public schools in Oklahoma.

As a member of CKenergy
Electric Cooperative, you have the opportunity to participate in the Operation Roundup program.
The program works by allowing co-op members to round up their monthly electric bills to the nearest dollar amount. The spare change is transferred to
CKenergy's Operation Round Up fund and dispersed to local charitable causes.

### AMOUNT OF GRANTS GIVEN IN 2016



Our foundation approved a total of \$43,288.96 for grants since the beginning of this year. Those funds will be used to improve the lively hood of individuals, fund school programs, help local law enforcement better protect citizens, and so much more!

We are a nonprofit, member-owned corporation. Rural Electric Cooperatives do not pay income taxes, but we do pay gross receipts tax (in lieu of property taxes). These taxes, paid by Caddo Electric and Kiwash Electric totaling \$1,240,616,63 were paid to the Oklahoma Tax Commission, which distributes the money to school districts located in counties in which we serve. The amount of taxes paid to a school district depends on the number of miles of line the cooperative has in that district. The amount of taxes paid in 2015 is shown in this chart by school districts.
